Reference is made in 5.2.1 (b) and in the note to 6.2.2 (a) to the “relevant national legislation” In Namibia this means the Consumer Protection Policy and Competition Act 2 of 2003

Reference is made in 5.2.1 (c) and the in the note to 6.2.2 (b) and 10.1.2 to the “relevant national legislation”. In Namibia this means the Foodstuffs, Cosmetics and Disinfectants Ordinance 18 Of 1979, the Meat Corporation of Namibia Act, 2001 (Act No.1 of 2001)

In 3.1 there is no Authority administering the standard in Namibia

In 3.10 documented procedure means a “procedure” in any form and not necessary “written procedure”

In 4.3.2 “the food handling organisation (FHO); shall establish a system through which records of all process required to ensure the safety of food are verified by a competent person” not limited to a “signature”)

In 5.3.1 a “competent” member of the FHO shall be appointed as a food safety representative not a “member of the management of the FHO”

Refer to “top management”, where the standard state “management”

In 5.5.3. add (h) a review of suitability of the food safety policy and  
5.5.3 (l) Achievement of the food safety objectives

In 6.1.1 top management shall “commit to provide necessary resources” but not necessarily “in writing”

In 7.3 use the term “non-conformities” in the standard, and not “non- conformances”

In 8.2.2 “it is recognized that not all FHO will be able to have a completely independent internal auditors” however FHO shall make efforts to ensure objectivity of the internal audit process.
